Olympic themed challenge for Sussex Primary Schools

A Pulborough based company has launched a new initiative giving Sussex primary schools the chance to design their own Olympic themed award stickers for their sports day.

Classroom Capers has teamed up with the West Sussex County Times and local disability awareness Charity, Enable Me, to ask primary school pupils to design a set of winner stickers that can be given to students coming first, second and third in sports day events and also a generic taking part sticker so that every student receives a sticker for participating.

Local wheelchair athlete and aspirant Paralympian, Seb Trezise, Sports Officer Officer at Enable Me is the official judge for competition entries. Ranked number 2 in Great Britain and 22 in the World for Discus, Seb is taking time out of his busy training schedule to support the competition.

Three schools will be chosen as winners, representing Reception, Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 pupils. Each winner will receive 1,000 stickers printed with their own designs, 25 metres of Classroom Capers' exclusive Sports Day border to

create an in-school display of the children's work and a 20% Classroom Capers discount voucher valid on orders within 6 months.

All entrants will be given the opportunity to have their stickers printed at a discounted rate, with all the profits raised being donated to Enable Me.
